Rating Rationale

Acuité has reaffirmed and withdrawn the long-term rating of '**ACUITE B+**' (read as **ACUITE B plus**) and the short-term rating of '**ACUITE A4**' (read as **ACUITE A Four**) on the Rs.12.19 Crore bank facilities of JAI PRABHUJI IRON AND STEEL PRIVATE LIMITED.

The rating continues to be flagged as "Issuer Not-Cooperating" and is based on the best available information.

The team has received the withdrawal request from the client because the client does not want to continue the rating. A No Objection Certificate for the same has been received from lender.

The rating withdrawal is in accordance with Acuité's policy on withdrawal of rating.

About the Company

Jai Prabhuji Iron and Steel Private Limited (JPISPL) was established in 2004 by Mr. Raj Kumar Choudhury, Mr. Nawdeep Khaitan, Mr Kailash Kumar Goel, among others. The company is engaged in the manufacturing of MS ingots and has installed capacity of 40000 tons a year. The manufacturing facility is located at Dhanbad, Jharkhand.

Non-cooperation by the issuer/borrower:

Acuité has been requesting for data, informations and undertakings from the rated entity for conducting surveillance & review of the rating. However, the issuer/borrower failed to submit such information before the due date. Acuité believes that information risk is a critical component in such ratings, and noncooperation by the issuer along with unwillingness to provide information could be a sign of potential deterioration in its overall credit quality. This rating continues to be flagged as "Issuer not-cooperating", in line with prevailing SEBI regulations and Acuité's policies.

Limitation regarding information availability:

The rating is based on information available from sources other than the issuer/borrower (in the absence of information provided by the issuer/borrower). Acuité endeavored to gather information about the entity / industry from the public domain. Therefore, Acuité cautions lenders and investors regarding the use of such information, on which the indicative credit rating is based.
