#### **Rating Rationale**

Acuité has downgraded the long-term rating to 'ACUITE B' (read as ACUITE B)from 'ACUITE B+' (read as ACUITE B plus) and reaffirmed the short-term rating of 'ACUITE A4' (read as ACUITE A four) on the Rs. 5.00 crore bank facilities of Mars Construction on account of information risk. The rating continues to be flagged as "Issuer Not-Cooperating" and is based on the best available information.

#### About the Company

Mars Construction was established in 2006 as a partnership firm by Mr. Ratan Paul and Ms. Madhuja Bhattacharya. It is engaged in civil construction projects in Durgapur, West Bengal. The company executes contract for Central Public Works Department (CPWD) and other government and private projects in West Bengal. Its entire orders are tender based. The company is working primarily in Durgapur, Asansol and other parts in West Bengal. The firm executes projects on a standalone basis as well as joint ventures.

## **Unsupported Rating**

#### Non-cooperation by the issuer/borrower:

Acuité has been requesting for data, information and undertakings from the rated entity for conducting surveillance & review of the rating. However, the issuer/borrower failed to submit such information before the due date.
