## Rating Rationale

Acuite has downgraded its long term rating to 'ACUITE D' (read as ACUITE D) from 'ACUITE B+' (read as ACUITE B plus) on the Rs 9.40 crore bank facilities of Nabha Duplex Limited. The rating continues to be flagged as "Issue Not Cooperating". The downgrade is on account of default as recognized from CIBIL suit filed account for the bank loan facilities availed from Bank Of Maharashtra.

## About the Company

Nabha Duplex Limited (NDL), incorporated in 1988 is a Punjab-based company promoted by Mr. Pulkit Gupta and Mr. Lakshay Gupta. The company is engaged in the manufacturing of duplex and boardpaper with grams per square meter (GSM) of 150 to 350 GSM. The firm has a manufacturing unit with an installed capacity of 9,855 metric tons per annum. The raw materials are procured from Punjab, New Delhi, Haryana and Rajasthan. The finished product is sold to traders and manufacturers in north India and exported to Nepal. The products find application in the packaging industry.

## Non-cooperation by the issuer/borrower:

Acuite has been requesting for data, information and undertakings from the rated entity for conducting surveillance & review of the rating. However, the issuer/borrower failed to submit such information before the due date.

Acuite believes that information risk is a critical component in such ratings, and non-cooperation by the issuer along with an unwillingness to provide information could be a sign of potential deterioration in its overall credit quality.

This rating is, therefore, being flagged as "Issuer not-cooperating", in line with prevailing SEBI regulations and Acuite's policies

## Limitation regarding information availability:

The rating is based on information available from sources other than the issuer/borrower (in the absence of information provided by the issuer/borrower). Acuite endeavored to gather information about the entity/industry from the public domain. Therefore, Acuite cautions lenders and investors regarding the use of such information, on which the indicative credit rating is based.
